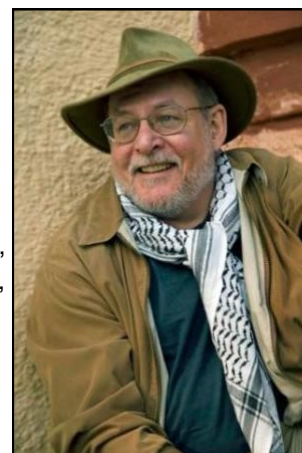

Indiana Jones will be here!

No, but Dr. Stephen R. Phillips will be at the Center on August 9 at 1:00 pm.

His talk on ancient Egypt forensic anthropology will take you to Egypt about 2,000 years ago, to explain in non-technical terms the basics in identifying bones as a female versus a male, how to approximate age at death, and what the ancient bones can tell us about a person.

A highlight of this talk is a re-examination of a possible 3,300 year-old royal murder case.



Dr. Phillips specializes in the analysis of ancient Egyptian and modern skeletal remains, mummies and mummification techniques, as well as the application of forensic anthropology in the study of our human past.

Dr. Phillips' talks are infused with some humor making his talk enjoyable while learning about the past. Come to the Legacy Room and experience this unique presentation.

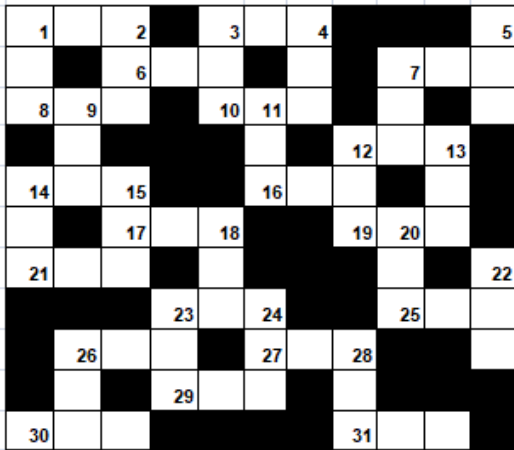

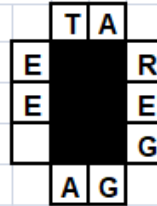
