The Pennridge Community Center is one of the four full-service senior citizen centers operated by the BUCKS COUNTY ASSO-CIATION FOR RETIRED AND SENIOR CITIZENS (BCARSC), a non-profit corporation. The BCARSC is funded through the PA Department on Aging, and through self-supporting projects. BCARSC is an equal opportunity employer.
